Concerns: MISDESCRIBED CARGOES

Dear Valued Customer,

Recently ocean carriers such as Evergreen have encountered substantial problems at discharge ports when local authorities discovered that cargoes inside the carrier's containers were misdescribed and, in many instances were actually proscribed materials such as garbage and waste. As a result of such misdescriptions Evergreen Line has incurred substantial costs because of actions taken by local authorities to prevent the importation of such misdescribed cargoes.

Because of these occurrences, Evergreen would like to remind its loyal customers of their obligation to properly describe and identify the cargoes they are shipping. The obligations of our shippers to properly describe the cargo are set forth in Evergreen's tariff, its bill of lading, its service contract terms (if applicable), the U.S. Carriage of Goods by Sea Act and the Hague Rules and/or Hague Visby Rules as applicable. We, therefore, sincerely urge you to properly insure that the description of the cargo you are shipping is accurate, as well as its weight, quantity and quality so that future misdescription problems can be avoided.

Your cooperation in this regard is sincerely appreciated. Needless to say if this problem continues Evergreen will take all steps necessary to recover from shippers who continue to misdescribe cargoes all charges, fines, penalties or claims arising from such misdescription.
